President's Annual Report

Welcome NZCSA Members and Honorary Guests to the 2013 NZCSA Annual General Meeting!

Over the past year, the NZCSA Executive Council and I have done our best to fulfill our Association's mission; "to provide a support network for our members and to be their voice at all levels whilst providing an unforgettable student experience."

While most of our efforts have been behind the scenes, they will no doubt enhance the current and future NZCC student experience.

A year ago, almost to the day, all of us entered into these positions because we saw the massive potential to make our school even better, and now after reviewing the year in preparation for today, and I extremely proud and pleased to acknowledge that we have accomplished a lot since then!

The aim of this report is to provide the membership with an overview of all the Association has achieved over the past 12 months.

The 2012/2013 Executive and I started in office at a significant point in the Association's history. Previously, the College was able to fund membership and the Association was well funded with 97% membership. With the change in government legislation, there was a withdrawal of funding by the College and the Association membership went from 97%

to nil. All students had to opt in and pay a membership fee. Vanessa Van Dyke VP Administration will have more on this in her report.

In addition, there was no formal agreement from the College for the Student Association to represent the students. Straightaway, the Executive and I continued the negotiation and completion of the official delegated authority with the Administration of the College, which was originally started by the previous 2011/2012 NZCSA Executive Council. We also added more student support via additional liaisons for anti-bullying and discrimination.

Please rest assured that while we have added an official document and official positions for NZCC, these roles already fell under the umbrella of our Association's official Rules, which were ratified by the Association membership September 26th 2010; therefore, we did not have to change any NZCSA documents. In other words, the delegated authority is now more defined, officially authorized roles on the NZCC Administrative side for the NZCSA, while we already had these in place and documented on our side.

For instance, as previously and currently stated in our Rules (3.1a and 3.1d), "The purposes of the Association are to... a) to act as the appointed representatives of the membership body regarding the administrative, academic and clinic processes, requirements and facilities established by the College" [and] ... d) to act as the appointed representatives of the membership body with respect to the College faculty, management and staff, the College Board of Trustees, the College Alumni Association, the New Zealand Chiropractic

Association, the New Zealand Chiropractic Board and various other local and international Chiropractic, healthcare, governmental, non-governmental private and commercial bodies.” Elise McMinn, VP Communications will cover more on added support and positions in her report.

I realize this may be out of the normal order of events, but I would love to take this time to publicly thank and praise the efforts of last year’s Association President Petra Watson, as well as Rachelle Hardie-Neil, Pieter Kachelhoffer, Dr Eric Russell, and Sarah Rowland for their tireless efforts in setting up all of those important documents and positions. We do realize you regularly go above and beyond your NZCC job description, and we cannot thank you enough.

Also, I want to acknowledge the whole College for staying true to their word by listening and respecting our collective student voice. At any educational facility, the students’ voice is extremely important because it offers direct, unbiased feedback to what is being perceived; and at NZCC, it is no different.

Over 3 months we received amazing constructive criticism, and on November 5th, we sent a detailed letter to the Administration, specifically to Pieter Kachelhoffer. The letter addressed class issues for the 2012 school year on behalf of our 2012 members, and we also included possible solutions or recommendations to the issues we highlighted.

Pieter, thank you so much for showing so much respect and professionalism by responding within 24 hours and acknowledging that the letter contained very important

aspects that needed serious attention. We are very grateful that there was immediate action and we still are seeing the positive changes from your hard work. Thank you.

Also, for all of you members who offered your insight to your year reps; thank you so much and please note that your voice is, and will continue to be heard.

From the very beginning of our term in office, the Executive and I foresaw the potential drop in membership, so we spearheaded membership drives by providing more monetary benefits for the student membership, including decreased prices for NZCC's Lyceum. Thank you Rachelle Hardie-Neil, Gemma Angus, Gemma O'Sullivan, and Charlotte Laurent for your continual support, and making Lyceum more accessible for students. We really appreciate it!

As the Executive and I took office, we recognized the importance of our image as we were seeking Corporate Sponsorship to provide a future student scholarship. We wanted to demonstrate a more professional side and improve the overall brand and image of the NZCSA, so we reconstructed the Association's website. We also made changes to the website that increase the accessibility for students. While it was great to reconstruct and update our website, unfortunately our efforts to attract potential sponsors and/ or donors were unsuccessful.

Also, we had hoped that there would be a surplus of money available to establish a scholarship program, but as we had a considerable drop in membership, this unfortunately was

not possible. We do hope this is something that the incoming Executive continues to work towards.

Continuing on from the previous year, the NZCSA offered the sales of StudentCards, which provided student discounts around Auckland. For one reason or another, they were not very popular. I feel that as an Executive we have been very careful and cautious with our spending while doing our best to support individual students, clubs and year levels in their endeavours. Miqdad Rashid VP Finance will address all of this and much more in his report.

On September 18th, 2012, the brand new NZCSA Executive and I organized our first event, and threw Chiropractic a 117th Birthday Party. The event proved to be a great success, and in October, we threw an Oktoberfest BBQ, which provided an awesome opportunity for students to once again, eat delicious food and hangout under the sun. On October 16th, the NZCSA Executive and I celebrated World Spine Day, and soon into the 2013 school year, we threw our annual Flat Warming party. Also, recently we had our first official NZCC Pyjama day. All of these fun details will be covered more in Sam Keeling's VP Social report.

In October 2012, we proposed the Parking Spot Prize, where students could submit a video explaining how they were making a positive change on campus, and were deserving of the CSA President's parking spot. In true Kiwi modest form, no one submitted a video in the 10 months the competition ran for.

In the beginning of 2013, I established and submitted a bid on behalf of the NZCSA and the NZCC WCCS Chapter (of which I am also an active member and Durban 2013 Delegate) to host a Chiropractic educational booth at the annual Holistic Cancer Congress in Auckland, NZ. The booth was accepted, and myself as well as the NZCC WCCS representative (and NZCSA member) Sam Walker were the only representatives from the Chiropractic profession. It was a huge success (over 200 attendees), where we informed Healthcare Professionals and individuals seeking Holistic Healthcare options on Chiropractic care and Chiropractic education. It was also great, because the NZCSA offered a free ticket, worth over \$200 to NZCSA member, Lani Leonard, who won it in a NZCSA member draw. Through correspondence with the Congress' founders, I am doing my best to ensure the booth is longstanding, and I am also doing my best to organize a Chiropractic Speaker for next year's event.

A few days before the first official school day of 2013, the NZCSA Executive met with the Year 1s at Orientation Day. We are happy to note that we have continued the mentor program from last year, which has given students from various years the opportunity to support each other as well as offer friendship to those who are new to Auckland. Thank you to those students who have offered their time and energy as mentors.

Over many months, we worked hard on a student survey along side the New Zealand Chiropractors' Association (NZCA) representative Dr Alice Cade and NZCSA member Brody Cleave. I would love to acknowledge the hard work

and efforts from both Dr Cade, as well as the diligent work from Brody. Dr Cade, thank you so much for your patience and empathy. And Brody, you are a true representative of why NZCC is so great – you became a member of the NZCSA on your first day of school and you immediately offered to help the NZCSA in any way that you could. You are a prime example of a role model. Thank you.

I have a few more standout NZCSA members that I would love to recognize: Nick Ujdur, thank you for your continuous work behind the scenes. Every little thing adds up, which makes NZCC even better than before.

And Andrew McCracken, thank you so much for being the Year 1 Rep, as well as coming up with the great idea to have an unveiling for the new Gold Lounge! It has been a pleasure brainstorming with you.

Over the last few months, we have arranged and coordinated a visual renovation for the NZCC student lounge on campus because we felt the blank, white walls seemed dreary and uninspiring, and that an improvement to the learning environment would ultimately foster cohesion and school pride.

One future art project consists of students' gold handprints covering a purple wall, with the slogan "I can change the world with my own two hands." This overhaul is in preparation for an official unveiling of the "Gold Lounge," named after Reggie Gold, for the students and faculty of NZCC, as well as for our planned guest of honor, Dr Irene

Gold who will hopefully visit in September 2013. The event will also include a barbeque and ribbon cutting ceremony.

The second art project consists of the winning design from the student mural competition. It is my pleasure to announce that Dr Irene Gold was our honorary judge and has decided the winning design. Congratulations to Max Patel!! Thank you for sharing your love and we look forward to seeing your masterpiece soon!!

The third art project that will be soon carried out is a quote and epigram wall, next to the NZCSA office door. We are excited to see these plans come to fruition as we spent months in planning.

In the last few months, myself, Jagoda Janik, Phil Lawson and Robert Baker, constructed and proposed plans for a community garden on the NZCC campus. Recently, the plans were accepted by administration, and I will oversee a committee that will carry out the project. I have also contacted the NZCA and are in correspondence with them concerning financial support for our proposal. We have recently approached a few garden and landscape companies for additional support as well. It is exciting to know that soon there will be more natural beauty on campus as well as delicious fresh veggies!

Over the past term there has been several huge changes to staff and administration, notably the addition of Dr Phil McMaster as the new NZCC President. While it was a pleasure to work along side Dr Eric Russell, we are thrilled to

work with Dr McMaster and the Board of Trustees to move the College forward in an exciting new direction.

For instance, midway through June, the Chairman of the Board, Dr Ash Pritchard personally emailed the NZCSA Executive to ensure that the Board had accurate and current data from which to create new strategies. They felt it was valuable to gain the internal (performance) analysis of NZCC from a student perspective. We easily generated a prompt response from your feedback, which you relayed to your year representatives, who in turn informed our VP Communications Elise McMinn. Please keep in mind that your voice is valuable and does make a difference. Thank you so much to those who have given their feedback.

At this time I would love to recognize Mark Saunders, a former Board member who has been a huge support of our Association for many years. We are happy to hear that he is pursuing other passions, but we acknowledge that his presence will surely be missed.

Soon after Dr Phil was selected as the new NZCC President, he contacted and organized a dinner with the NZCSA Executive where we discussed prospective plans. Also, we have been in contact and have been brainstorming with Dr Dave Russell.

Many plans have been mentioned and set up for the future, and another includes further adding to the Association's website. I am in the midst of researching the history of the NZCSA, which may lead to a database of previous NZCSA Executive Officers. This could be potentially used for

marketing, referrals, or for general interest. Thank you to Drs Dave Russell and Marina Fox for your help with this project.

I know I've already thanked this person a few times in this address, but I need to emphasize and express how incredible Rachelle Hardie-Neil is for this Association, as well as for NZCC. She has been the NZCSA's unofficial advisor who regularly puts the students first. Rachelle, I could not have done most of this without you. I cannot thank you enough for your mentorship as well as friendship. It really means a lot to me.

To all the previous Executive Officers who have been in contact with us: Petra, Brian, Thea, Mimi, Derek, Drs Matt Jacob, Gordon McPherson-Rayner, Adeela Afiz, Dave Russell, Marina Fox, and Matt Sherson, thank you for your continual support and advice. As we were all new to the Executive this year, any input and opinions were much appreciated!

To the future Executive, I know you will support the student body in the best way you can, and please know that we're here to help if you ever need it.

This year I can proudly say that each Officer on the NZCSA Executive Council has done way more than what is written in any official document listing their roles and responsibilities.

Vice President of Administration's Annual Report

This was the first year in quite a few, that the NZCSA membership fees were not collected with tuition and other administration fees at the beginning of the year by the NZCC front desk staff. A change in legislation prohibited the collection of non-tuition fees by the school and prevented the previously instated automatic payment/membership fee collection by the college from being performed. As a result, all membership fees were either directly collected by the NZCSA Executive Council or done by direct transfer; membership forms were collected in person or via email.

The change in procedure resulted in a significant drop in membership for the 2012-2013 academic year. The Executive Council has plans to promote membership and will be implementing them in the next academic year. We thank The New Zealand College of Chiropractic for their support and promotion of membership this year. We look forward to a bigger and better 2013-2014!

Membership Funds

This year there was a change in membership funds' collection, where as in the previous years the NZCSA fee of \$35 per student was collected through student fees and paid to the NZCSA. Due to changes, Studylink will no longer cover student association fees, and NZCC administration will no longer collect NZCSA fees; therefore, members must individually contact and pay the NZCSA for their membership.

To date, the membership fees have been collected in a different way than past years, whereas a lot of marketing and promoting of the NZCSA had to be done in order to have people join the association rather than have it accounted for in their school fees.

Unfortunately, the strong membership of 97% NZCC students last year dramatically dropped this year to 30%, most likely due to the change in legislation. While we had a reduction, membership funds were boosted by a special Lyceum ticket deal for NZCSA members. This was very beneficial, as many NZCC students became members to buy the cheaper tickets.

Student Support Fund

The NZCSA continued to operate the Student Support Fund at the end on 2012 and going into 2013. There was money in the fund from last year, which mainly helped students with resit fees. NZCSA and NZCC are in talks for topping up the account due to the large amount of people requiring financial

aid at the end of 2012, so that we can continue to help students this year especially around exam time.

Also this year, the NZCC Administration changed the resit fees so that students will not have to pay for resits but will have a limited amount of resits. The Student Support Fund will remain to help students in hardship who cannot support themselves for various reasons, and provide help with entrance and exit exam resits, which still require a payment to resit.

The student support fund is accessed by student members of the NZCSA who apply through the formal application process as outlined on the website for the NZCSA. Each case is considered on an individual basis.

It is expected that the next executive will continue to offer this service to its members at the rate of \$2000 per semester, or another amount deemed appropriate in the future. It is hoped that the NZCC will offer a grant in the future to contribute to this fund.

Events Income and Expenses

With various restrictions with on campus functions, it has been somewhat of a “dry” year, although we have had some fun little things happening around college that have actually ended in a slight profit which will be outlined in the social part of this report. We still believe that the next Executive will strive for functions that are fun yet also rewarding and profitable to the student association, it will keep the association sustainable and able to hold grander events.

Student Cards

One subtle way of raising funds was selling Student Cards, however for one reason or another, some of the students who bought them have yet to receive them. This was mainly due to poor communication with the Student Card Company and we are working to rectify this. The finer details are still being negotiated, but ideas include a refund, or a free card at the start of next year to the respective students.

This year we did the same deal with Student Cards, which meant that the students paid \$20, and \$3 went to the NZCSA. This year's sales were different to how the Executive sold them last year. For instance, we sold them on a demand basis (buy after a student pays) rather than last year, where the Executive bought a bulk order and tried to sell all of them to students. The idea this year saved and made us money, but the execution could have been unquestionably better.

Continuing on from last year, there was a bit of confusion and it was found that the association still owed the Student Card Company money from last year. To keep a healthy relationship this year, we took it on and rectify it by paying the owed amount.
